What is Erasmus+?





Travel agency activity

What happens when you combine advertising and cultural heritage? You get a cool travel agency poster with 3 UNESCO-recognized destinations. Participants didn't hesitate to show their creativity in this activity.

Meaning of names

Participants were assigned to figure out the meanings of all of their names. Since they come from many different countries and cultures, their names stem from different origins, and it was interesting learn about to background of the project's participants. They discussed their names and how they got them in groups before writing them on a poster, gathering their diversity in an artistic manner.







Proverbs in native language

During this activity, participants were divided in national teams to write proverbs from their countries. The challenge was to write these expressions in English in their literal meaning and for the other people to guess their hidden meaning. Everyone had fun while discovering how language shapes the way we think and view the world.

The traditions of the world

In this activity each national group was assigned to present a tradition, a ceremony or something they normally celebrate.





Mug exchange

On the first day, mugs were exchanged, each brought along with its own unique story. Some were old, possibly left in a closet by a grandmother, while others might have been purchased hastily at an airport. Yet, despite their differences, each mug found a place on a shelf in another country, to be remembered fondly as part of a shared experience.





Appointment game

In this activity, hours from 9:00 to 14:00 were written on a piece of paper. Everyone then found a partner to schedule an "appointment" with for each free hour. Partners met up as planned to discuss various relevant topics.









Cultural appropriation

Participants started this activity by watching a sketch from a comedy show discussing the topic cultural appropriation. After the video, participants were given a short explanation of the term cultural appropriation. Following that, participants were divided into small groups where they discussed and thought of a few examples. This was a great activity because the topic automatically leads to great discussions, given that it's such a complicated topic navigate.

Sustainable development goals & UNESCO

In this activity, participants were grouped in teams, and throughout the day, they had to answer a list of questions about UNESCO, the main objectives it promotes, and the benefits and responsibilities of UNESCO.





Charades

Each group had 2 sustainable development goals (ScDGs) to present, but to do so, they had to play mime, and the remaining groups had to guess which sustainable development goals were being present.
